

**Presentation Guidelines**  
**National Ocean and Coastal Mapping Inventory Workshop**  
**12-13 January 2011**

Thank you for agreeing to participate in the National Ocean and Coastal Mapping Inventory Workshop and make a presentation on one of your agency's data repositories or data discovery and delivery activities. In preparing your presentation, please include the following information:

- Purpose, goal and mission
- Tasks performed or services provided, using the stages of the FGDC lifecycle to describe what your data repository/activity does with ocean and coastal geospatial data. (see A-16 Supplemental Guidance, <http://www.fgdc.gov/policyandplanning/a-16/stages-of-geospatial-data-lifecycle-a16.pdf>)

Where in the stages of the geospatial data life cycle (Define, Inventory/Evaluate, Obtain, Access, Maintain, Use/Evaluate and Archive) does your repository or activity play a primary or supportive role? Present a sufficient level of detail to foster the next level of discussions: how to develop a sustainable OCM Inventory from distributed sources.

- Data types (themes, types of measurements, etc.)
  - Include those data currently addressed
  - Address data of interest but not currently addressed
  - Which OCM framework data layers, if any, are currently included (elevation: topography and bathymetry, seismic data, surficial imagery)
- Sources of data (Federal, other government, academic, proprietary, etc.) and primary customers
- Any needs or services that might be addressed by other programs, projects, or organizations.
- Identifiable gaps in data holdings or services provided
- Relevant success stories

Other information:
